alley Spokesmen Racing Team has been the racing arm of the Valley Spokesmen Bicycle club for over 30 years! We are a multidisciplinary group of racers, with a focus on Road Racing, Cyclocross, and Mountain Biking

VSRT participates in races and also promotes a race every year. Our next hosted race is VSRTCX (CX=cyclocross) September 23 at the historic Rancho Los Mochos (RLM) Boy Scout Camp, south of Livermore on Mines Road near mile marker 14. VSRT is currently volunteering ~20-30 man-hours per month at the venue refining our cyclocross course options and also helping expand a set of mountain bike trails. If you would like to volunteer to help build out some mountain bike trails (and ride them!!!), please let us know! Trail build days include campfires, hot dogs, and camping when possible.
